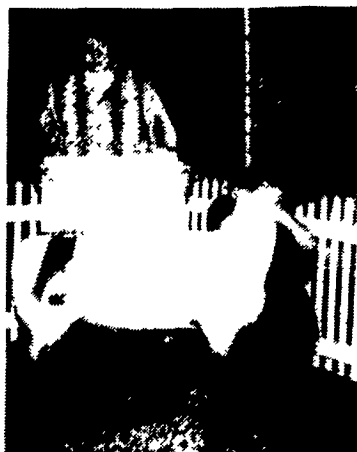

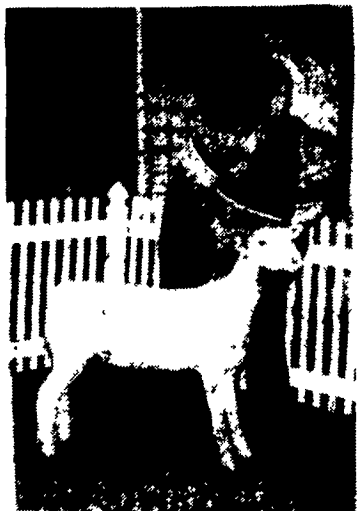

Record Set At National Jersey Heifer Sale

REYNOLDSBURG, Ohio — Topping last year's average of \$2,992, the 1994 edition of the National Jersey Heifer Sale posted an average of \$3,353, a new record.

The sale was held June 20 in San Antonio, Texas, in conjunction with the annual meetings of The American Jersey Cattle Club and National All-Jersey Inc. This was the first sale ever to be held on the famous river walk on the San Antonio River.

The 48 heifers sold averaged \$3,353.13 with the top price of \$10,100 paid for the consignment of Kurt and Carol Alberti, Wendell, Idaho. AU Tildies Berretta Tincia-ET, a three-month-old daughter of Mason Boomer Sooner Berretta, will make her new home at Wirkus Jerseys, Edgar, Wis.

"Tincia" had the highest Parent Average Protein in the sale with a PA Protein of +77. "Tincia" has four brothers at various A.I. or-

ganizations, including 21st Century, United Breeders Service, Sire Power and Noba.

Salvation Brook Paramount, consigned by Duane and Christina Anderson of Salvation Jerseys, Milan, Miss. was the second-highest selling animal. H&B Jerseys, Crockett, Va. bid \$7,000 for the 10-month-old daughter of Molly Brook Brass Major, PTI +364. "Paramount" is out of one of the first "Berretta" daughters to calve, Salvation Berretta Plush.

George Dorsey of Jersey Pride, Bozeman, Mont., was the volume buyer purchasing eight head at \$22,150.

Eight percent of the gross sale price from animals sold in the National Heifer Sale is used to fund the Jersey Youth Programs. Co-chairmen of the event were Ralph Frerichs, LaGrange, TX, and Kris Koon, Brashear, TX. The sale was managed by Jersey Marketing Service, with Merlin Woodruff of Ohio as the auctioneer.

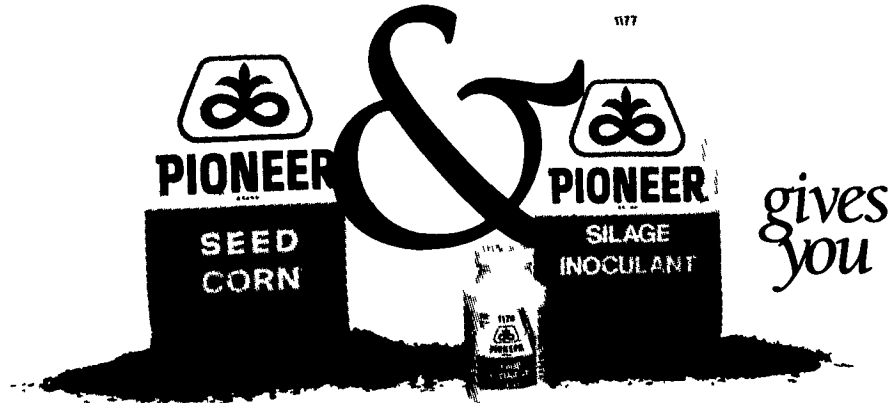
