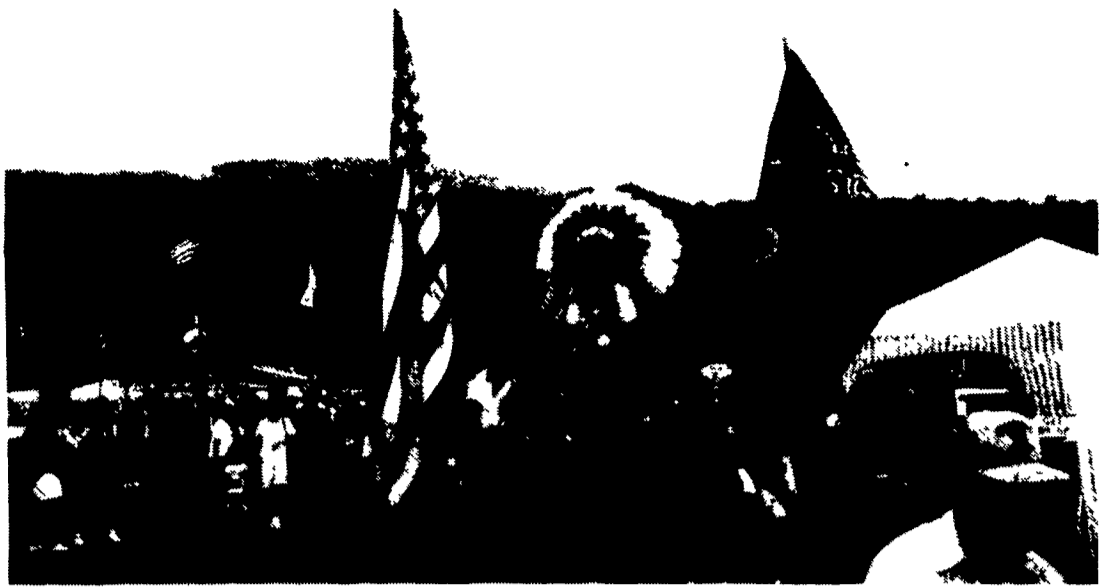

Scholarships Available

HARMONY, N.J. — Teens in grades 7 through 12 are eligible to receive full or partial scholarships to the New Jersey 4-H Conservation School to be held here July 31-August 5.

The conservation school program is coordinated by Rutgers Cooperative Extension and is a residential program for youth interested in environmental issues. The week-long program focuses on waste management alternatives, water quality issues, and conservation of natural resources.

Highlights of the week include tours to manufacturing facilities, the state trout hatchery, the county's energy from refuse facility, and a day-long canoe trip on the Delaware River. In addition to the educational tours, teens gain self esteem and group skills participating in a rock-climbing program and group activities.

The following scholarships are available:

- Warren County residents - two scholarships

from the Warren County Federation of Sportsmen Clubs.

- New Jersey residents - two scholarships from the NJ Federation of Sportsmen.
- Bergen County residents - two scholarships from the Bergen Co. Federation of Sportsmen.
- Union County residents - two scholarships from Ogden Martin.
- Central Jersey residents - two scholarships from Central Jersey Chapter of Trout Unlimited.

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of financial need, scholastic aptitude, and interest in the program.
