DETENTE IN SPACE

On July 17, 1975, Soviet cosmonaut Aleksei Leonov and American astronaut Thomas Stafford shook hands in space. The historic meeting was the result of three years of negotiations and was the first U.S.-Soviet joint space project. Apollo 18 and Soyuz 19 remained linked together for 47 hours while the crews visited each other's space crafts and performed experiments together. At a time when the cold war between the two super powers was still in full swing, many people thought the cooperative venture was doomed from the start. But the men proved that Americans and Soviets could work together, at least under certain circumstances.

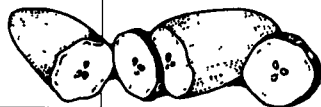
Here are a few poison ivy pointers: Wearing washable gloves and long sleeves for protection, dig out the plants. Bury them in an out-of-the-way place. Never compost poison ivy — urushiol, the element that reacts with your skin, remains after the plant has decomposed. Never burn the plants — the irritant is dispersed by the smoke. When you are finished handling the plants, strip off your clothes directly into the washing machine, gloves last, and wash them in hot soapy water.

SHELLY'S CUCUMBER SALAD

- 1 large cucumber
- 1 small onion
- 1 teaspoon vinegar
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1 pint cottage cheese
- 2 cups non-dairy whipped topping
- 1 11-ounce package lime gelatin dissolved in 1 cup water

Wash cucumber well to remove wax coating. Grate cucumber (with skin) and onion into large bowl. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. Chill until set.

Makes 8 servings.
