

FFA/4-H Swine And Sheep Show, Sale Set

GETTYSBURG (Adams Co.) — Adams County 4-H and FFA members are busy getting ready for the 11th Annual Swine and Sheep Show and Sale. This annual event will take place on Tuesday, July 26 at the South Mountain Fairgrounds, near Arendtsville.

More than 60 hogs and 50 lambs will be shown in market classes with a champion and reserve champion selected for each species. In addition, the 4-H and FFA members will compete in senior, intermediate, and junior combined fitting/showing classes for each species. A top individual will be named in each fitting/showing class. The swine show starts at 8 a.m. and the sheep show at 11 a.m.

All hogs and lambs at the show will be sold Tuesday evening, July 26, at a competitive bid auction. This is an ideal opportunity for anyone to purchase quality pork or lamb for the freezer. Interested buyers bid the price per pound they desire for an animal they select, and the animal will be auctioned to the highest bidder. Leaders and members will try to ar-

range transportation to a local butcher. After the animal is sold, the buyer may give specific instructions to the butcher for specific processing and preparation. The sheep sale begins at 7 p.m. and swine sale begins at 7:45 p.m.

The youth livestock program is designed to help youth develop an understanding of feeding, fitting,

and showing swine and sheep. The support of the community is essential to help bring the process to a successful end. If a buyer is not interested in the meat product, they may still buy an animal. After purchasing the animal, provisions will be available to reassign the animal at market price to normal

meat product buyers on the grounds. As a buyer, you simply absorb the cost difference between what you paid and the market resell price.

All buyers, from private individuals to corporate sponsors, will receive recognition through newspaper ads and articles. Anyone

Beef Evaluation Workshop Set

LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) — All folks interested in cattle feeding are invited to participate in a workshop designed to improve your knowledge and understanding of important aspects pertaining to the cattle industry.

Scheduled for July 27 and 29, this two-day workshop will include live cattle grading by all participants, quality assurance tips, and advice on feeding for profit. Demonstrations at the packing plant will focus on beef that fits the box, hot fat trimming, injection site blemishes, and new grading proposals.

The live animal session will be

held at New Holland Sales Stables, New Holland, at 7 p.m. on July 27, where participants can compare their grading estimates with a panel of experts. The carcass aspect of the workshop will be held at 7 p.m. on July 29 at Stoltzfus Meats, Intercourse. During this program, actual carcass data can be compared with estimates, and participants will vis-

ualize the disadvantages of cattle that are too big, overly fat, or poorly managed.

Conservation Districts To Hold Quarterly Meeting

STATE COLLEGE (Centre Co.) — The Pennsylvania Association of Conservation Districts, Inc. (PACD) will hold its quarterly meeting Wednesday, July 27 - Friday, July 29 here at Toftrees.

The PACD Executive Council will meet, Clean Water Farm Awards will be presented, and the State Conservation Commission will meet. State Senator J. Doyle Corman from Centre County will be the featured speaker at a banquet Thursday evening.

The PACD Executive Council, at its Friday meeting, is expected to take action on the PACD Endowment Fund and PACD membership. The council will discuss the Conservation District Allocation Fund Program, the USDA reorganization, and the upcoming National Association of Conservation Districts, Northeast regional meeting as well as update the Delaware Estuary Program.

Farmers from Blair, Northumberland, and Dauphin counties

will receive the Pennsylvania Chesapeake Bay Clean Water Farm awards. The awards, sponsored jointly by Pennsylvania's Departments of Environmental Resources and Agriculture, recognize farm operations that excel in water quality protection. Secretary of Environmental Resources Arthur Davis and Walter Peechatka, Deputy Secretary of Agriculture, will present the awards during a luncheon Thursday.

The State Conservation Commission will meet Thursday, July

28 at 10 a.m. On the agenda is reappointments to the Nutrient Management Advisory Board and a discussion of the draft certification regulations for nutrient management specialists. The commission also is expected to appoint two new members and reappoint a third. Ross Orner of Clearfield County and Jack DeHoff of York County will be appointed to the commission, while Ed Kuckuck of Indiana County will be reappointed for another three-year term.
