Pa. Envirothon Champions Selected

TURBOTVILLE (Northumberland Co.) — The eleventh annual Pennsylvania State Envirothon was held recently here at the Pennsylvania Power and Light Company's (PP&L) Montour Preserve.

The 1994 Envirothon champions are from Parkland Senior High School in Lehigh County. Second place went to Red Lion Area Senior High School in York County. Blue Mountain High School in Schuylkill County finished third.

Teams of five students from 51 counties participated in the Envirothon, which challenges the students' knowledge in the five natural resource areas of aquatics, forestry, soil, wildlife, and current environmental issues. This year's current issue was acid rain.

In order to participate in the State Envirothon, teams had to win a local Envirothon sponsored by their county conservation district. More than 5,200 students were involved in local Envirothons this past spring.

The annual state program is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Association of Conservation Districts, the State Conservation Commission, and the Hershey Foods Corporation.

The Department of Environmental Resources' Bureau of Land and Water Conservation, Forestry, and Air Quality Control, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission, the Pennsylvania Game Commission, and the United States Department of Agriculture's Soil Conservation Service

developed tests and resource materials and provided technical assistance.

Every State Envirothon participant received a certificate of participation. The state and regional winners received plaques and environmental education books. The winning team also won a white water rafting trip.

Regional awards were presented to Northern Cambria High School, Cambria County; Great Valley High School, Chester County; Lebanon Christian Academy, Lebanon County; Cowanesque Valley High School, Tioga County; Warren Area High School, Warren County; Honesdale High School, Wayne County; and Franklin Regional High School, Westmoreland County.

County teams that arrived Friday afternoon were involved in a variety of "kickoff" activities coordinated by the Montour Preserve's Jon Beam and hosted by Don Jacobs of WNEP-TV's "Pennsylvania Outdoor Life." Earl Shriver presented a Birds of Prey program to the students on Friday evening.

The 1994 State Envirothon champions from Parkland Senior High School will represent Pennsylvania at the National Envirothon planned for August 3-7 at the University of North Carolina in Asheville, N.C. Twenty-three states from across the country and a team from Nova Scotia will compete at the national level.
