College of Agricultural Sciences Exhibits Building and Theatre

Main Street, between W. 9th and W. 10th (near the farmhouse)

From farm to table, keeping our food safe is everyone's responsibility. Through interactive exhibits and demonstrations, learn how research and education are applied to reduce residues, increase processing safety and improve food-handling techniques in the home. Visit a greenhouse with tomatoes, peppers and cucumbers to learn how integrated pest management and biological control are helping to protect your health and the environment while increasing profits for the farmer. See how field traps and an 800 telephone service are helping sweet corn growers monitor insect populations and reduce pesticide use. See a calf, piglets and chicks and learn how producers are applying new methods to reduce pathogens in and on live animals. Take the food safety challenge quiz, and see hourly demonstrations on the do's and don'ts of safe food handling in the kitchen. Penn State faculty and staff will be on hand to answer questions and give advice.
