## Call For Papers For Goat Handbook

BRUSH PRAIRIE, Wash. -- A new extension goat industry handbook and national collection of goat materials are being planned by a joint USDA-extension-industry committee. Topics to be covered include all aspects of the goat

industry, including dairy, meat and fiber production and marketing.

Factsheets are solicited from individuals having appropriate technical expertise. Sections in the handbook are planned for anatomy and physiology; dairy production; fiber production; forages and pastures; genetics; health and diseases; housing & facilities; management; marketing; meat production; nutrition; products; reproduction; and the goat industry.

All submissions will be reviewed by an editorial committee and a set of factsheets will be selected to appear in the new handbook. Additional factsheets, bulletins, computer software, photos and slides of merit that may not fit in the handbook will be

considered for the national collection. This collection will be made available on a CD-ROM disc as the National Goat Database. Individuals are encouraged to recommend topics and potential authors; and to write and submit papers and other materials for this project.

Those interested should request a copy of the guidelines for submissions. These guidelines will need to be followed to assure due consideration of the manuscripts. 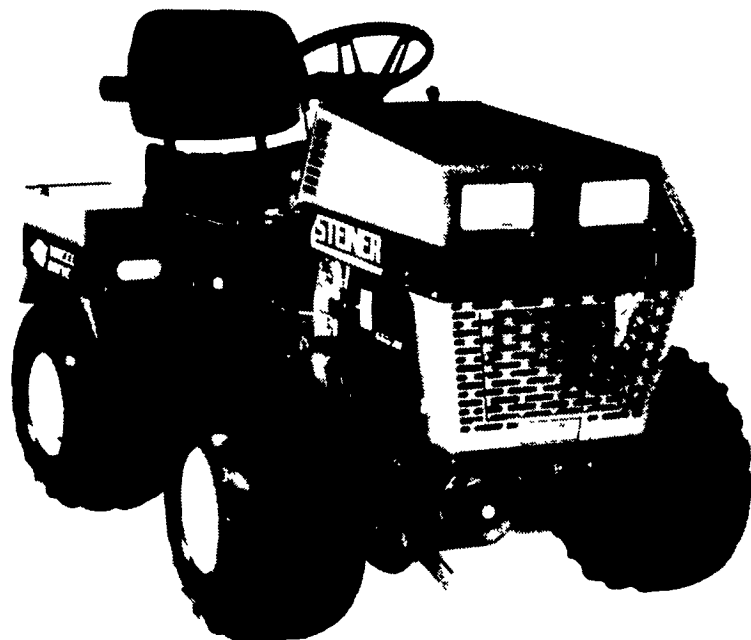
