A STORM NAMED CAMILLE

ugust 17 marks the twenty-fifth anniversary of one of the most intense hurricanes ever to hit the U.S. mainland Hurricane Camille struck Louisiana and Mississippi with winds estimated at 175 to 200 mph. The storm surge peaked at 24.2 feet and the barometric pressure (26.73 inches) was one of the lowest ever recorded in the Gulf of Mexico Camille was downgraded to a serious rain squall as she moved north into Tennessee But as the 'squall' crossed into Virginia she cut loose with intense rain averaging 4 inches. but in excess of 27 inches in some areas. Camille raged for 6 hours in Virginia, devastating an area 40 miles wide and 120 miles long. Over, 400 latalities and \$1.42 billion in damages were attributed to Camille


