Lisa Reiff was also named grand champion showman. Reserve showman was Regina Landis, and Kathy Musser was honored as novice champion.

In other sale results, the 101-pound reserve champion middle weight champion, shown by Kendall Reiff, was sold to Fox's Market for \$2.40 a pound.

Allison Hughes showed the reserve champion light heavyweight. Amy Bollinger had the reserve champion heavyweight and Sarah Boyd showed he reserve champion lightweight.

The market lamb sale averaged a record \$2.32 a pound for the lambs, with a sale total of \$8,373.60.

WESTMINSTER, Md. - The Carroll County 4-H and FFA Fair burst into action on Monday, August 1 and ran through Saturday, August 6.

Lines stretched throughout the

buildings on Monday as youngsters stood in line to admit their artwork, woodwork, clothing, and field crops.

Booths and banners and natural resource projects began to fill the main building as the day wore on. Ribbons of blue, red and white

appeared first, followed by the purple class champions and the larger overall champion and reserve champion rosettes.

A tractor-driving contest began at noon. Then, sheep, swine and beef steer began to arrive. But this was only the beginning.

Monday evening saw the parade and the crowds that followed. The Farm Queen Contest and the Carroll County 4-H Performing Arts Talent Show kept the crowds alive until late in the evening.

Throughout the week, rabbits, poultry, dairy cattle, food, photography and garden exhibits arrived. A mule pull, a horse pull, an antique tractor pull, and an antique horse-drawn carriage show pulled crowds in each night. along with an array of entertainment. There were three bands, a kareoke night, and cow chip bingo. The petting zoo was a hit for the very young, with llamas, goats, sheep, horses and a donkey, rabbits and more. An English and a Western Horse show took place, too.

One of the most well known events at the Carroll County 4-H and FFA Fair and the biggest fundraiser for next year's fair was the annual cake auction, which was held on Wednesday evening, August 3. The event raised \$23,850 for the Carroll County Fair Board. One hundred and thirty-nine champion and blue ribbons cakes were raffled off, but it was the grand champion baked item that took the cake. Amanda Tracey of Millers, Maryland baked the blueberry cake using blueberries from 100 or so blueberry bushes in her family's blueberry patch. The cake bought a whopping \$1,500 dollars1 and wa spurchased by Franz School Photography.
