DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES FINISHED NARROWLY MIXED WITH SLIGHT PRESSURE SEEN AS A CORRECTIVE MOVE TO A STRING OF RECENT HIGHER TRENDS. OPTIMISTIC WHEAT EXPORT OUTLOOK, HOWEVER, LIMITED DECLINES. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES WERE MODERATELY HIGHER AMID REPORTS OF DRY CONDITIONS IN PARTS OF THE MIDWEST WHICH COULD HAMPER BUMPER CROP POSSIBILITIES. WHEAT NARROWLY MIXED. CORN 2 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 1 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 6 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES HAVE CLIMBED CONSISTENTLY THE PAST FIVE DAYS AND DESPITE CONTINUED CONCERNS OVER DECREASING WORLD WHEAT PRODUCTION, PRICES SLIPPED LOWER AS A CORRECTIVE MANEUVER. GOOD EXPORT DEMAND CONTINUED TO OFFER SOME SUPPORT. RECENT RAINS REPORTED IN MIDWEST AREAS HAVE BEEN SCATTERED AND MANY AREAS REMAIN DRY. CONCERNS THAT DRY CONDITIONS IN CORN AND ESPECIALLY BEAN CROPS HAVE NOT MATURED ENOUGH TO EXCEED THE EXPECTED HIGH YIELD PROJECTIONS, AS BEANS ARE MADE IN AUGUST, STRENGTHENED PRICES. LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND THIS WEEK ALSO GAVE ADDITIONAL SUPPORT TO PRICES.

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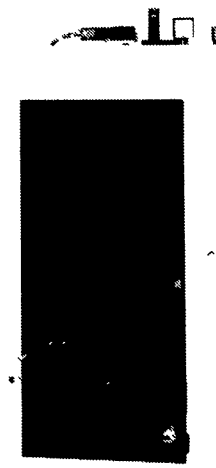


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
