Three classes were offered for judging: a class of 3-year-olds. 4-year-olds, and a class of cows producing 30,000 pounds of milk.


In the youth division 13 and under, first two places were captured by Jesse Martin, of Ephrata, and Wesley Martin.

The top three in the ladies division were Michelle Morrissey, Pattie Hurtgun, and Stephanie Wagner.


In the men's division, the top two placings were Chris Anderson and Elwood Ohlinger.


