Because of crutches, the 12-year-old could not control the enegetic sheep which was held in control by Troy Bollinger. Auctioneer Harry Bahman pressed the crowd to

respond to the need by pleading, "Come on folks, this fellow needs to pay a huge doctor bill."

John Ebersole of Speedwell Construction took the top bid for \$950. "I gotta support my own grandkid," said Ebersole. Keystone Farm Credit was the contender.
