DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY EXCELLENT EXPORT DEMAND FOR WHEAT AND ADDITIONAL BIDS ON THE BOOKS DROVE WHEAT PRICES HIGHER. SPILLOVER STRENGTH FROM SOYBEAN PITS SUPPORTED CORN PRICES ALONG WITH DECREASING OLD CROP SUPPLIES. BEAN PRICES CONTINUED TO CLIMB DUE TO IMPROVED EXPORT SALES, GOOD CRUSH DEMAND AND THE POSSIBILITY FOR RAIN OVER THE WEEKEND IN MIDWEST AREAS.

WHEAT 2 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 2 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 4 TO 6 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 5 TO 10 CENTS HIGHER. EXPORT SALES SEEMED TO FLOOD IN TODAY AND SOME OF THE RECENT REJECTED OFFERS WERE REBID. SPRING WHEAT AND WHITE WHEAT WERE BIG SELLERS WITH JAPAN, THE PHILIPPINES AND YEMEN THE BIG BUYERS. CORN PRICES TURNED HIGHER FOLLOWING SOYBEAN STRENGTH. OLD CROP CORN IS DWINDLING AND HARVEST IS STILL SEVERAL WEEKS AWAY. WORRIES CONTINUE TO EXIST OVER PROSPECTS FOR A BUMPER CORN CROP. RAINFALL IS IN THE FORECAST FOR THE MIDWEST AND CORN BELT AREAS TOWARD THE END OF THE WEEK AND INTO THE WEEKEND. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES TURNED POSITIVE IN ANTICIPATION OF MUCH NEEDED MOISTURE. SOYBEANS ENJOYED GOOD EXPORT DEMAND.
