The Holstein show was smaller than last year's because of the recent concerns over bovine viral diarrhea (BVD), which kept the numbers of animals down.

Brown Swiss grand and reserve champion was Adam Spittler.

Two linebacks were also a part of the 4-H show for the first time in memory. They were shown by Meredith Baily, champion and Alison Krain, reserve.

At the show, 196 animals were exhibited by 4-H dairy club mem-

Among the animals exhibited were 80 Holsteins, 16 Ayrshires, 17 Brown Swiss, 24 Guernseys, 51 Jerseys, six Milking Shorthorns, and two Linebacks. Exhibitors were also honored with master fitter and/or master showman awards.

The blue ribbon animals from each class became eligible to compete in the 39th Pennsylvania Junior Dairy Show on Monday, Sept. 26 at the Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg. At the state show, southeast district winners will compete against winners from other 4-H and FFA district shows.


