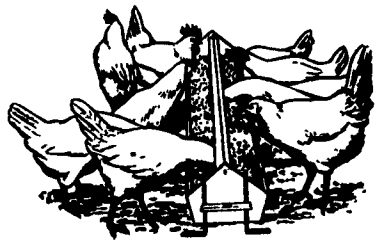

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE:

Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to barely steady with cautiousness reported in all areas. Demand covered the full range and was mostly moderate. Retail features improved demand. Supplies of brown eggs remained short in New England. White egg supplies were at least adequate or available.

Breaking stock supplies were adequate from regular sources, and the undertone was no better than steady. Light hen supplies were adequate to fully adequate for the light and unaggressive demand, and the undertone was generally steady.

Prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was generally steady with some cautiousness. Demand was mixed, and retail specials continued to provide the best movement. Supplies were adequate or available. The New York inventory was 16% below last Monday's level, and the New Jersey inventory was 9% below last week.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was fairly good on the generally adequate supply of 3 pound and heavier sizes. Lighter sizes were short. Live supplies were moderate; weights ranged desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 49 to 60 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady to instances firm. Bulk parts items were in good balance and clearing. Boneless skinless breast were irregular but in fairly good balance. Bone-in breast were fully steady to firm.

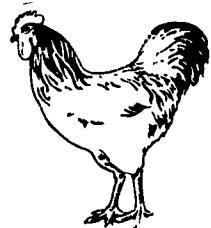

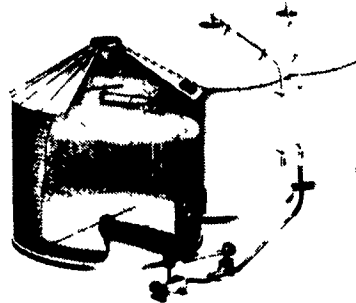
