Safety Expert To Edit Journal

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — Dr. Dennis Murphy, professor of agricultural engineering in Penn State's College of Agricultural Sciences, has been named the editor of a new quarterly publication, the Journal of Agricultural Safety and Health.

Published by the American Society of Agricultural Engineers, the first issue will be available February 1995, with subsequent editions appearing in May, August, and November. It is being launched in response to a growing awareness of the unique safety and health concerns in agriculture and rural areas.

"The National Safety Council reports that agriculture is the nation's most hazardous industry, with a work-related death rate 22 percent higher than the second most hazardous industry, mining and quarrying," Murphy said.

"Farming is not keeping pace with other hazardous occupations in improving its safety record. This new journal will help scientists, engineers and others concerned about farm and rural safety keep in touch with new research. opinions and theories."

The Journal of Agricultural Safety and Health will address farm and rural safety and health issues confronting all parts of the

world. The journal's interdisciplinary focus will include engineering, occupational safety, social psychology, public policy, education, industrial hygiene and public health.

"The journal will contain scholarly, peer-reviewed articles as well as abstracts of articles from other journals," Murphy said. "It also will feature listings of ASAE and National Institute for Farm Safety technical papers and a section detailing upcoming conferences, meetings, government agency activities and other announcements."

The journal welcomes articles on original research projects. evaluations of current intervention and demonstration projects, literature reviews, new or modified theories and models concerning agricultural safety and health problems, commentaries and edi-

Before joining Penn State in

1976, Murphy was employed as a safety engineer by the Argonne National Laboratory and the Crum and Forester Insurance Company. He was the first recipient of the Packer Engineering Safety Award presented by ASAE and has served as president of the National Institute for Farm Safety. Murphy is the author of "Safety and Health for Production Agriculture," a textbook published by ASAE.

The Journal of Agricultural Safety and Health will be the first new scientific journal published by ASAE since 1958. Yearly subscriptions are \$34 for ASAE members and \$65 for nonmem-

Farm Credit Declares Patronage Refund

LEWISBURG (Union Co.) -Northeastern Farm Credit, ACA distributed \$2.42 million in patronage to its members on August 31, 1994.
