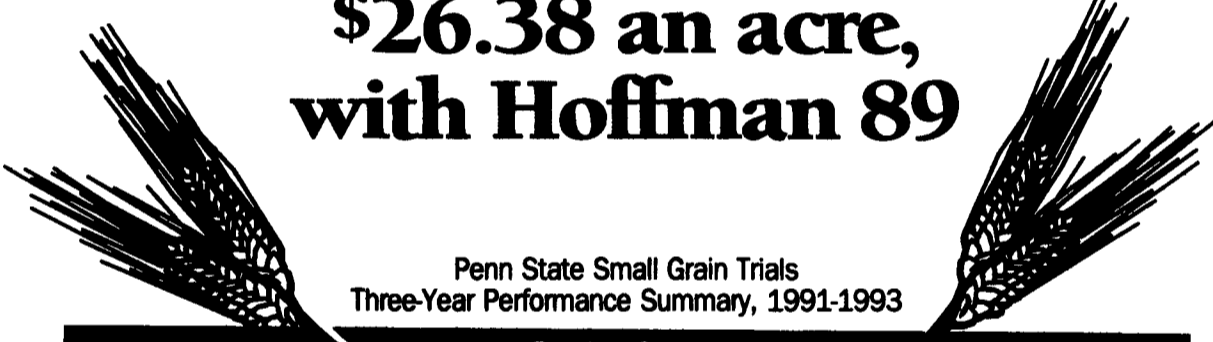
Bishard, York.
