through the Midwest Regional booth, located on the expogrounds. Members of the board and industry leaders are to be on site to listen and lead the forum.

According to a news release, issues participating breeders should be prepared to discuss include: the position of the breed in five years; the three most important areas upon which the organization should be concentrating effort; and ways in which the association can better serve its members.

"We encourage everyone with an interest in the Ayrshire breed to join us," said Jim McConnell, association president. "Conversation topics will range from where the breed should be in five years to how the association can better work together. The more ideas we have from all the different players on the team, the better the game plan will be," he said.

And in the same effort, those breeders who attend the North American Livestock Exposition, in St. Louis, at the expo center grounds will have the opportunity to voice their opinions about the association and the industry. That event is set to be held from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m., Nov. 7. For specific location information, inquire with NAILE staff.

According to McConnell, "We feel it is vitally important that all Ayrshire breeders have full opportunity to speak up about where they believe the breed should be headed.

"We're making it as easy as possible for breeders to let leadership know what they believe they need and want.

The association also recently mailed a questionnairre to all people who have done business with the association over the past 15 months. The deadline for returning those questionnairres to the association was Sept. 10.

"We know we have a breed with a sound genetic base and cattle that are profitable for their owners," McConnell said. "However, we also know that we are not making genetic progress at a rate comparable to the other major dairy breeds.

"The officers, directors, and staff are presently involved in developing a long-range strategic plan for the ABA and the Ayrshire breed," he said.

"When the plan is complete it will include specific goals and the steps necessary to achieve these goals within a defined time frame. The goals and the time frames established within this plan will become the bench marks by which we measure Ayrshires' progress."


