Ayrshire Breeders Get Opportunity to Voice Opinions

BRATTLEBORO, Vt. — Ayrshire breeders are to have an opportunity to air opinions they have about the directions of the breed, according to a series of recent news releases from the board of directors of the Ayrshire Breeder's Association, headquartered in Brattleboro, Vt.

According to the releases, the board is expected to dedicate the majority of its fall business meeting to identifying key areas and developing long-range strategic plans.

As part of that effort, it has announced that it has voted to create a breeders' forum to be held Oct. 5 at the World Dairy Expo in Madison, Wis.

The forum is to be held in a tent on the Expo grounds, with more specific information available

through the Midwest Regional booth, located on the expogrounds. Members of the board and industry leaders are to be on site to listen and lead the forum.

According to a news release, issues participating breeders should be prepared to discuss include: the position of the breed in five years; the three most important areas upon which the organization should be concentrating effort; and ways in which the association can better serve its members.

"We encourage everyone with an interest in the Ayrshire breed to join us," said Jim McConnell, association president. "Conversation topics will range from where the breed should be in five years to how the association can better work together. The more ideas we

have from all the different players on the team, the better the game plan will be," he said.

And in the same effort, those breeders who attend the North American Livestock Exposition, in St. Louis, at the expo center grounds will have the opportunity to voice their opinions about the association and the industry. That event is set to be held from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m., Nov. 7. For specific location information, inquire with NAILE staff.

According to McConnell, "We feel it is vitally important that all Ayrshire breeders have full opportunity to speak up about where they believe the breed should be headed.

"We're making it as easy as possible for breeders to let leadership know what they believe they need and want.

The association also recently mailed a questionnaire to all people who have done business with the association over the past 15 months. The deadline for returning those questionnaires to the association was Sept. 10.

"We know we have a breed with a sound genetic base and cattle that are profitable for their owners," McConnell said. "However, we also know that we are not making genetic progress at a rate comparable to the other major dairy breeds.

"The officers, directors, and staff are presently involved in developing a long-range strategic plan for the ABA and the Ayrshire breed," he said.

"When the plan is complete it will include specific goals and the steps necessary to achieve these goals within a defined time frame. The goals and the time frames established within this plan will become the benchmark by which we measure Ayrshires' progress."

PSU Dairy Nutrition Workshops Set

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — Penn State's extension dairy nutrition group is sponsoring four one-day workshops in mid-November for professionals in the feed industry.

The workshops are to be offered at four locations across Pennsylvania.

The \$30 registration covers conference room rental, lunch, breaks, and reference materials. Registration deadline is Nov. 8. For more registration information, contact a local extension office of the workshop coordinator, Virginia Ishler, at (814) 863-3912.

Lectures and demonstrations aimed at feed industry professionals are to emphasize new research and practical applications, featuring topics such as carbohydrates, intensive grazing, dry cow nutrition, particle size of forages and effective fiber, calf and heifer nutrition, and farmstead assessment as it relates to the environment and water quality.

The one-day workshops are to run consecutively: on Nov. 14, it is to be held at the Shadow Brook Inn and Resort, in Tunkhannock; Nov. 15 at the Holiday Inn, in Morgantown; on Nov. 16, at the Ramada Inn, in Somerset; and on Nov. 17, at the Garden Gate, in Butler.

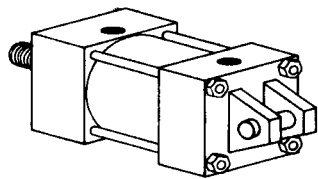
