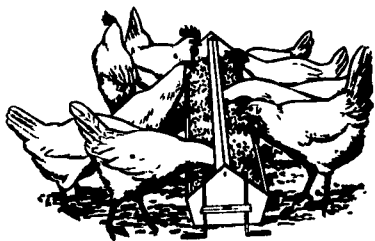

MARKET COMMENT: THE MARKET TONE WAS STEADY. DEMAND WAS MIXED ACROSS THE FULL RANGE, AND WAS MOSTLY MODERATE TO FAIRLY GOOD. SUPPLIES WERE GENERALLY ADEQUATE OR AVAILABLE WITH LARGE BROWN SIZES STILL TIGHT, AND GRADED LARGE OCCASIONALLY TIGHT WHERE GRADING PLANTS WERE STILL BEHIND SCHEDULE FROM THE LABOR DAY HOLIDAY. BREAKERS RECEIVED ADEQUATE SHELL EGGS FOR A MODERATE DEMAND. LIVE HENS WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE FOR THE MOSTLY LIGHT DEMAND. A EXTRA LARGE .67-.69, LARGE .65-.67, MEDIUM .56-.57.

Breaking stock supplies were adequate for the moderate and unaggressive demand, and prices were unchanged. Light hen supplies were at least adequate for the very light demand, and the undertone was steady.

Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 64 cents. Trade

sentiment was steady to firm. Breast items were available and were generally slow to clear. Legs and leg quarters were fully adequate. Wings continued to clear well.
