MARKET COMMENT: THE MARKET TONE WAS STEADY. DEMAND COVERED THE FULL RANGE AND WAS MOSTLY MODERATE. OVERALL, RETAIL MOVEMENT HAD SLOWED FROM THE PREVIOUS TWO WEEKS. SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE OR AVAILABLE, AND THE DISTRIBUTION BETWEEN UNGRADED AND GRADED EGGS BECAME BETTER BALANCED FOLLOWING THE PREVIOUS WEEKS' ATTEMPTS TO RESTORE POST-LABOR DAY GRADED FLOOR STOCKS. BREAKING STOCKS SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE UNDER A STEADY TRADE SENTIMENT. LIVE HEN OFFERINGS REMAINED ADEQUATE TO AMPLE FOR THE LIGHT DEMAND. A EXTRA LARGE .67-.69, LARGE .65-.67, MEDIUM .56-.57.

MYERSDALE (Somerset Co.)
— Some 44 animals consigned for sale at the Somerset Fall Classic, brought a total of \$69,095, about \$4,500 less than the 1993 total when 42 animals were sold at the Classic.

Eighteen milking animals sold for a total of \$31,392, or an average of \$1,744. Seventeen bred heifers averaged \$1,559 for a total of \$26,503.

Open heifers averaged \$1,425 a piece totaling \$9,975 for the seven animals. Two calves under three months were sold, one for \$850 and the other, \$375. Total was \$1,225 and the average was \$613.

Fred England from Williamsburg was top buyer. He bought eight animals, but the total spent by England wasn't disclosed.

Todd Lohr from Hooversville paid the top price of \$2,450 to consignors Paul Kinsinger and Henry Kinsinger of Oakland, Md. for Triple-Silo Mark Miranda.

Born January 5, 1992, Miranda due September 3, 1994 to Pacalamar Astronaut, had a "tremendous

pedigree and beautiful udder," according to Oren Bender, pedigree expert.


