Land Trust To Hold Harvest Fest

YORK (York Co.)—The Farm and Natural Lands Trust will hold its fourth annual Harvest Fest on October 22-23 at Brown's Orchard and Farm Market in Loganville.

The Trust is the only private, non-profit land preservation organization working to protect and maintain the rural and natural landscapes that make York Coun-

ty a desirable place to live and work. Proceeds from the festival will go to further the efforts of the Trust.

This year's Harvest Fest will offer expanded hours, running from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Saturday and from 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday. Events offered include continuous all-day entertainment, a celebrity Farm and Field "Glad-

iator Contest," straw maze, clowns, face painting, pumpkin painting, and Halloween masks; displays and demonstrations by York County Parks, York Wildlife, and Rehabitat; and horse-drawn wagon rides, pony rides, raffle and campfire.

Entertainers include Penny Royal-Celtic music; modern Icons-progressive folk; Contra Dancing by the York Folk Dance Association and accompanied by Bob Buckingham and the Contra Rebels (Ann Fallon, caller, instruction provided, public invited to participate); Pam and Don Geiselman; and the Haliwa Saponi Native Indian Dancers.

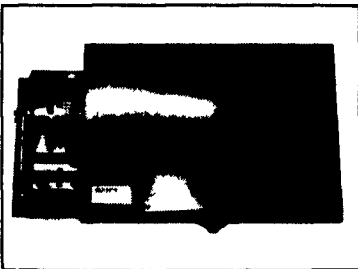

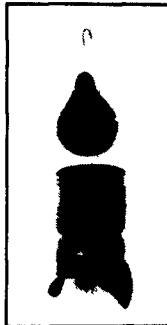

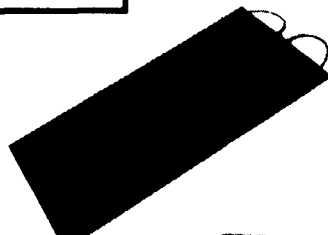
