ALEXANDRIA, Va. — Four successful young entrepreneurs have been named by the National FFA Organization as national finalists for the 1994 American Star in Agribusiness Award.

Neal C. Floyd, 21, Nicholasville, Ky.; Tammy L. Yost, 20, Joliet, Mont.; David Snyder, 21, Hamil-

ton, N.Y.; and Craig Eric Daniels, 20, Montello, Wis., were chosen as the best of the 1,445 American FFA Degree candidates. One of the highest honors an FFA member can earn, the American Star in Agribusiness will be chosen from the four finalists during the 67th National FFA Convention in Kan-

sas City, Mo., Nov. 10-12.

The finalists were selected based on their management skills and the quality and growth of their agribusiness programs. The candidates' leadership and FFA activities are also considered by the national, state and local FFA officials who select the finalists.

Each finalist will receive \$1,000 from the National FFA Foundation. The national winner will be awarded another \$1,000. In addition to the cash awards, the four finalists will travel to Europe with other national winners for an international experience tour.
