Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds varied from plant to plant, but was slowing overall. Offerings were generally limited on the under 3 pound sizes and fully adequate on the heavier weights. Live supplies were moderate, occasionally heavy; weights were in a full range and mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Trade sentiment was mixed in a range of barely steady to fully steady. In the parts complex wings were in best balance. Inquiry for other items was slowing and supplies were at least adequate from most shippers.

DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY: WHEAT PRICES EXTENDED GAINS, TUESDAY, AFTER EXCELLENT BEP WHEAT SALES REPORTS AND THE LARGER WEEKLY EXPORT INSPECTION FIGURES. CORN PRICES FINISHED MOSTLY HIGHER ON FORECASTS FOR RAIN AND COOL WEATHER WHICH WOULD SLOW HARVEST PROGRESS. SOYBEAN PRICES ARE MIXED. WHEAT 2 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. CORN MOSTLY UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. SOYBEANS MIXED. SUBSTANTIAL EXPORT ORDERS FOR WHEAT SUPPORTED PRICES WITH EGYPT THE NUMBER ONE BUYER. FUND BUYING ON THE BOARD CARRIED OVER FROM MONDAY WITH A BOOST FROM MONDAY'S LARGER WEEKLY INSPECTION REPORT. THERE'S NO SET ASIDE ACREAGE FOR WHEAT THIS YEAR AND PRODUCERS ARE PLANTING IN A DUST PILE. MUCH NEEDED MOISTURE IS FORECAST FOR PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. ACTIVE HARVESTING OF CORN AND LARGE YIELDS REPORTED, LIMITED

PRICE ADVANCES. HOWEVER, REPORTS OF RAINS AND COOLER TEMPERATURES MOVING ACROSS THE MIDWEST INTERJECTED LIGHT SUPPORT TO CORN PRICES. CORN PRICES ARE DOWN ABOUT TWENTY CENTS FROM HARVEST TIME LAST YEAR. SOYBEAN PRICES RECEIVED SOME STRENGTH FROM SOYBEAN PRICES AND FUND BUYING ON THE BOARD. HARVEST PRESSURE LIMITED SOYBEAN PRICE INCREASES. SOYBEAN PRICES ARE AROUND \$1.00 CHEAPER NOW THAN HARVEST TIME LAST YEAR.
