**CRUSADER WITH A DRAWING PEN**

September 27 is the birthday of Thomas Nast, the father of American political cartooning. Born in Germany in 1840, Nast immigrated to America when he was six years old and got his first job as an illustrator at age 15. From 1864 to 1884 every presidential candidate Nast supported was victorious. He used his politically pointed caricatures to expose corruption and to work for civil rights for immigrants and minorities. It was Nast who gave us the Democratic donkey, the Republican elephant, and our modern conception of Uncle Sam and Santa Claus. In fact, Nast not only drew the Santa we all know and love today, he also conceived and created Santa's North Pole home and workshop.

**EARTHWISE**

In many parts of the country, the season of drying laundry outside on a line is coming to a close. Short, dark, cold days make us glad we've got an electric dryer to turn to. Keep these rules in mind to keep energy use to a minimum. When possible, use the dryer during off-peak hours. Always dry a full load, but not stuffed full, or the dryer will have to run longer to dry the clothes.



**HOT POTATO SALAD**

- 6 slices bacon
- 6 tablespoons sugar
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
- 5 medium potatoes, boiled, peeled, and sliced
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- 2 cups water
- 1/4 cup green onion salt and pepper to taste
- 3 hard-boiled eggs, sliced

Fry bacon until crisp; drain, preserving 4 tablespoons of drippings. Blend sugar, flour, and mustard into drippings. Stir in vinegar and water; cook until thickened, stirring constantly. Pour over hot potatoes. Mix in onion, crumbled bacon, and seasonings. Top with eggs. *Makes 6 servings.*

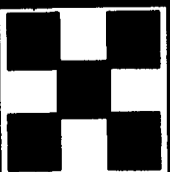
