Centerville Purina Plant Has Open House

CENTERVILLE (Lancaster Co.)—The Purina Mills, Inc., located on Hempland Road, was the location for an open house for customer appreciation. This open house was tied in with the announcement of the production of the one-millionth ton of feed that was produced at the mill and the 100-year anniversary of Purina Mills, Inc.

"Many farmers who were here 12 years ago when we opened the .plant are back again today," said Phil Jaquith, district sales manager. "And many of the people who work here grew up here. So you

can say we are a local company even though we are a national сотрапу.

The mill was opened in 1982 to produce meal feeds, especially poultry feed. At the time, many new poultry operations were being developed in the area. Later the need for other feed became evident, and two pellet mills were added in 1986. Now they produce 200,000 tons of feed per year and reached the millionth ton on Monday of this week at 7 a.m.

According to Marc Lewis, production manager, the special milestone ton was given to Abe

and Jay Hess of Bacon Acres in Conestoga. Hess's Mill delivered the feed, and Glenn Kunkel was the driver.

The plant runs 24 hours per day with two 12-hour shifts, five days per week. Saturday is clean-up and repair-equipment day. The plant employs 13 people, five in production, two in the office, two mechanics, two truck drivers, and two supervisors.

About 400 customers, prospects, and other guests attended the open house. Many of these visitors toured the plant.
