Offerings were fully adequate to ample and excess supplies were competitively priced to stimulate sales. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 64 cents. Trade sentiment was weak, occasionally steady. In the parts complex, boneless skinless breasts continued to tighten as retail inquiry developed for promotional activity. Other parts were fully adequate to ample,

particularly wings and leg quarters.


