

# Pizza Story

On Friday, August 26, approximately 300 people visited the Ag Day, "The Pizza Story" at the Carlisle Plaza Mall, presented by Cumberland County Farm Bureau Women's Committee.

The Story began with, "Once upon a time..." and went through seven chapters in the story.

**Chapter I - The Farm.** A scale model of the buildings, livestock, and machinery with price tags placed by the machinery was displayed. A new tractor would range from \$80,000 to \$100,000

is one example of information found on this table.

**Chapter II - The Wheat.** Examples of the wheat stalk, grain, a variety of flours, grain storage equipment and pizza crust helped to show the importance of the work and product from the grain farmer.

**Chapter III - The Sauce.** A tomato plant was exhibited beside a display of tomato at different stages of growth from blossom to vine ripe tomatoes. Commercially prepared and home-canned toma-

to products plus fresh herbs and other vegetables often included in pizza were arranged at this table.

**Chapter IV - The Pork.** A sausage topped pizza, meat cuts from the hog, recipes and tasty pork meat ball samples helped tell the Pork story.

**Chapter V - The Beef.** Mr Larry Huttenga, representing the Beef Council, displayed recipes and information on the correct handling of beef. Browned, lean ground beef was arranged on the pizza displayed at this table. A large poster showing named meat cuts available to the consumer

was displayed here, too.

**Chapter VI - The Cheese.** The Cumberland County Dairy Princess, Kimberly Orris, arranged a display which included free samples of cheese, one of the main ingredients of a pizza.

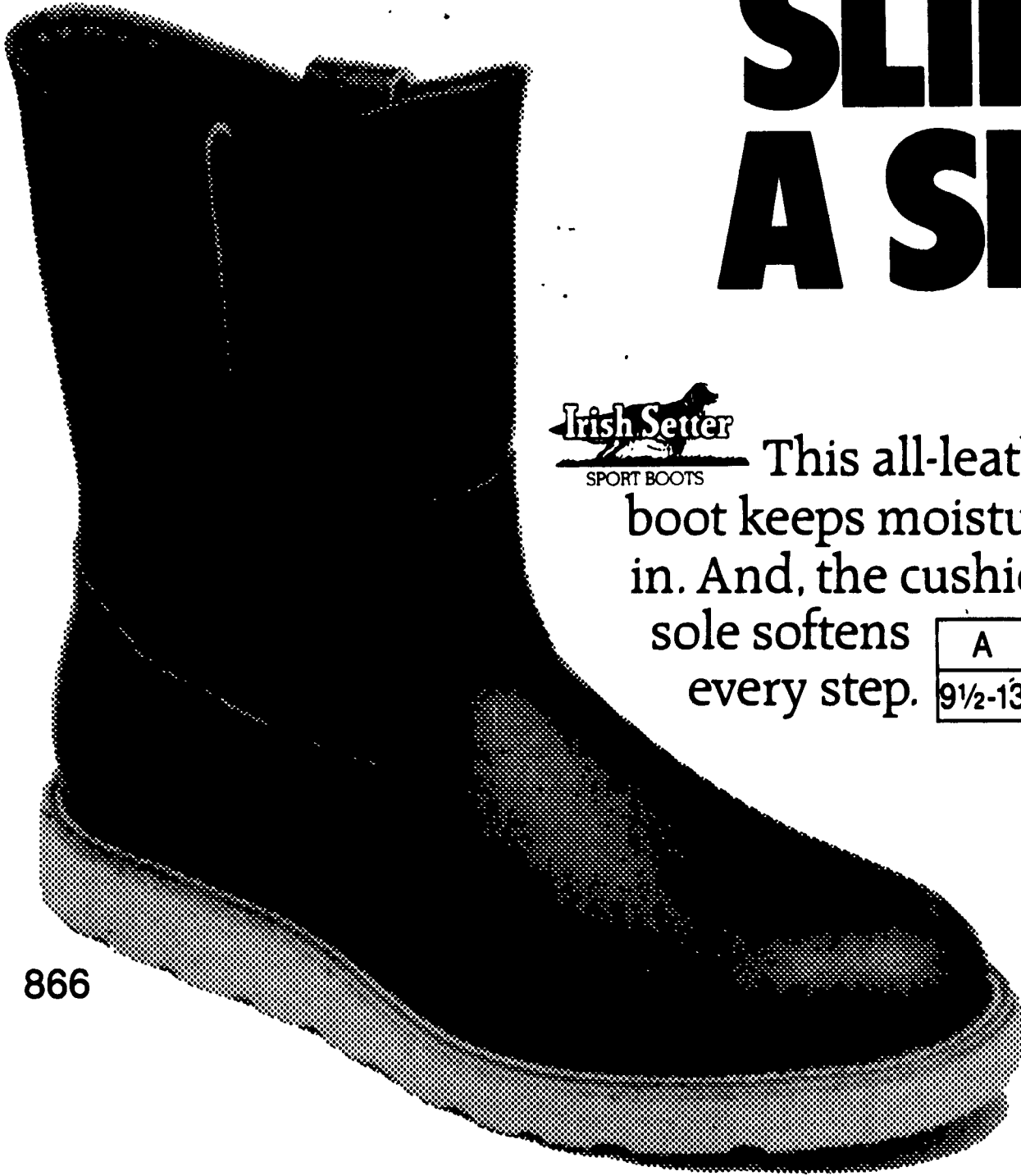
Amanda Rhoades, Cumberland County Farm Expo Little Miss, was available to meet folks for a time during the 1:00 to 8:00 presentation.
