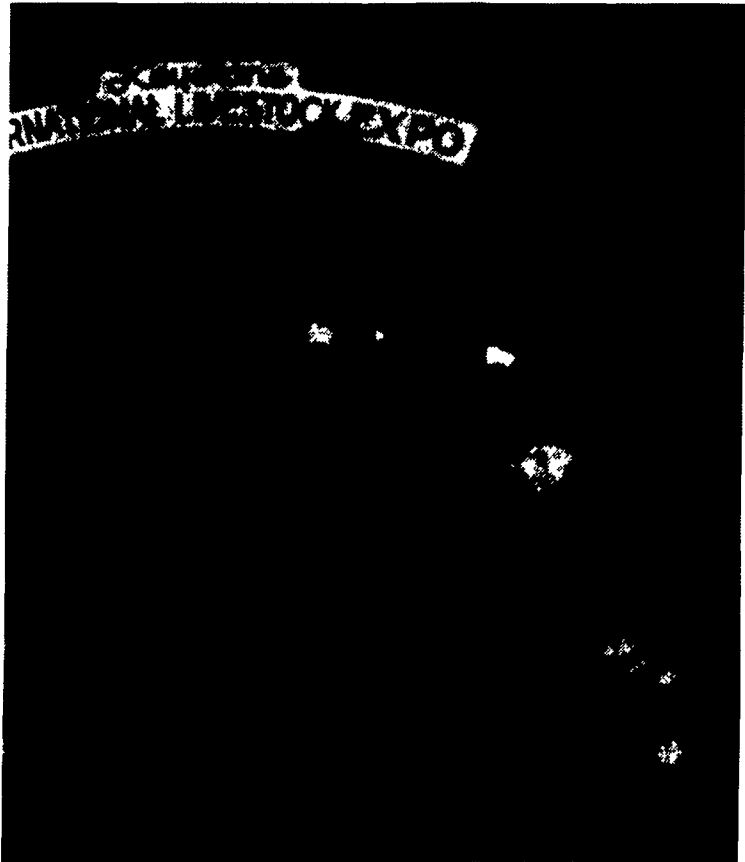


KILE Sheep Shows Display Champion Breeding Animals



From the left, Albert Pichler and Jeff Traver show the champion Merino ewe.

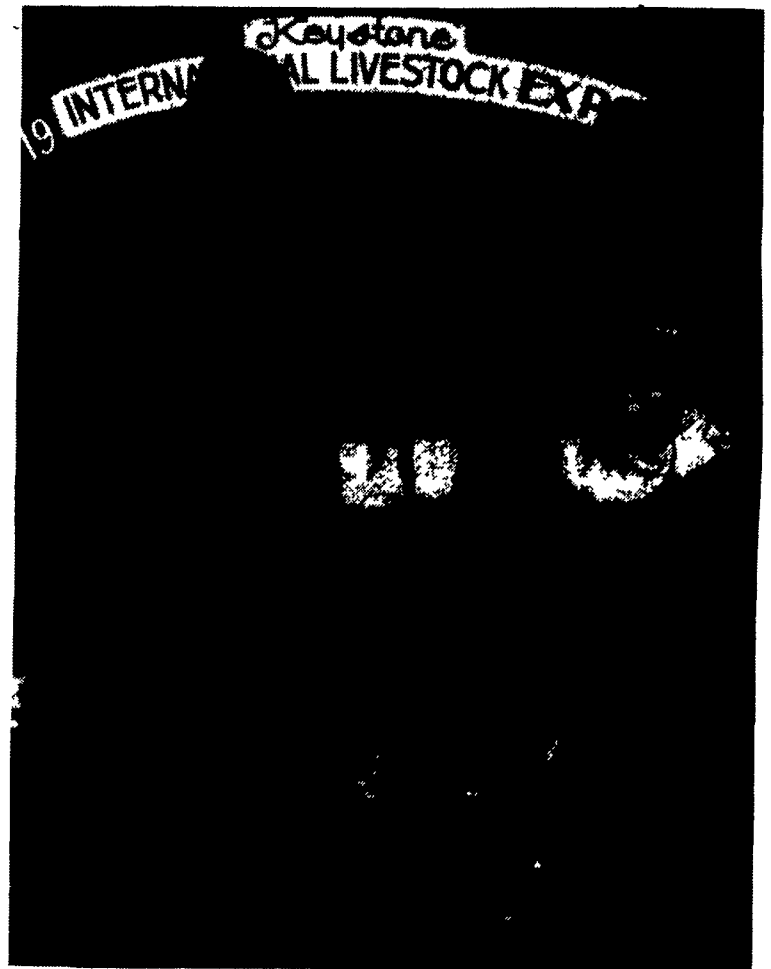

This year's sheep winners included:

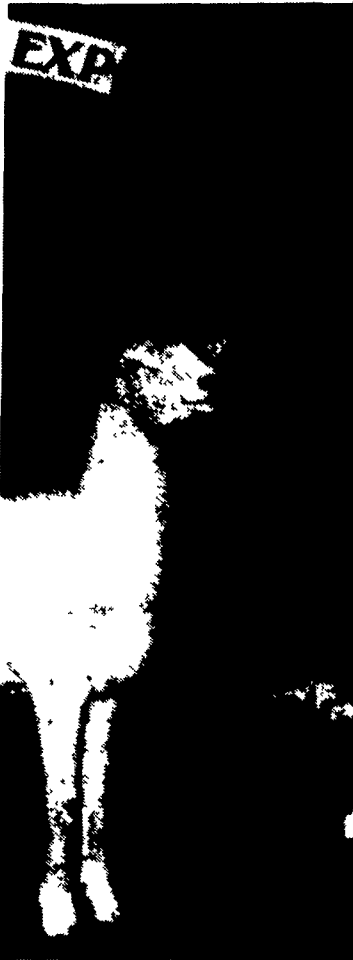

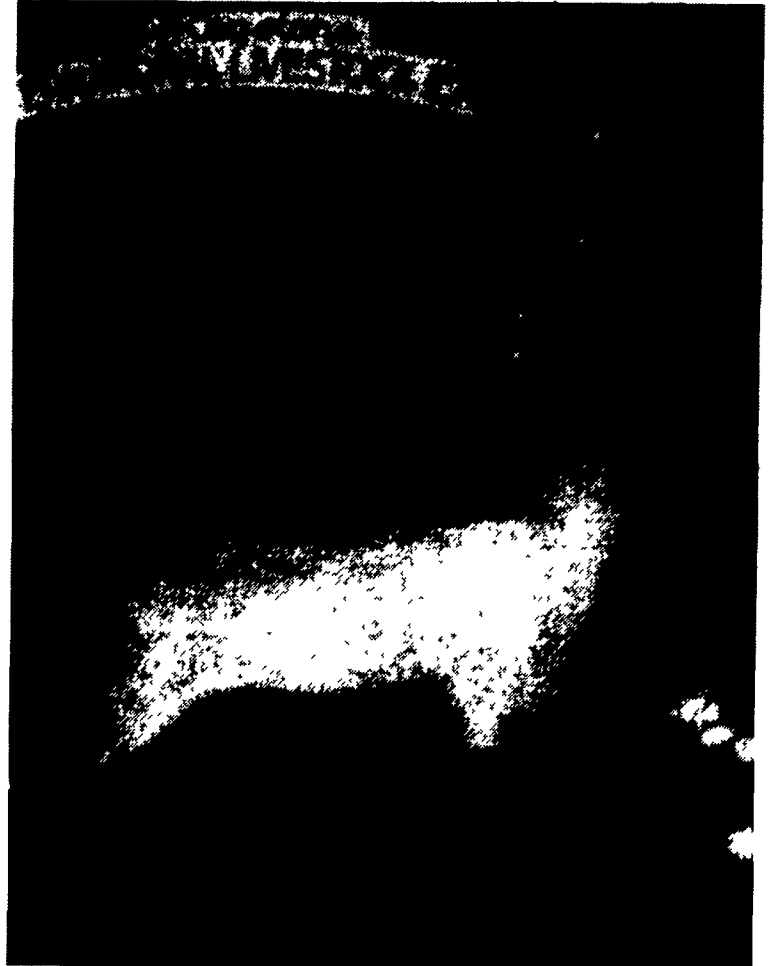

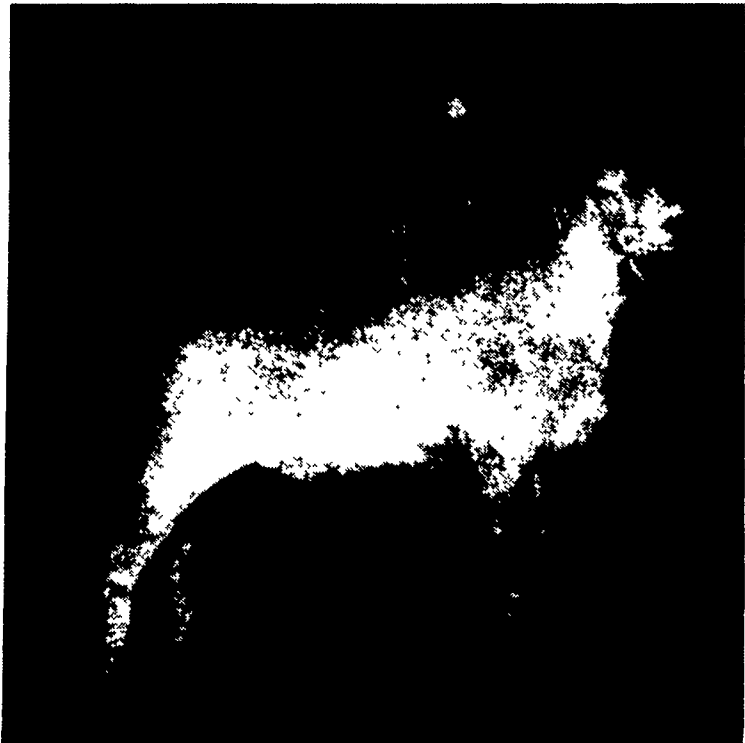

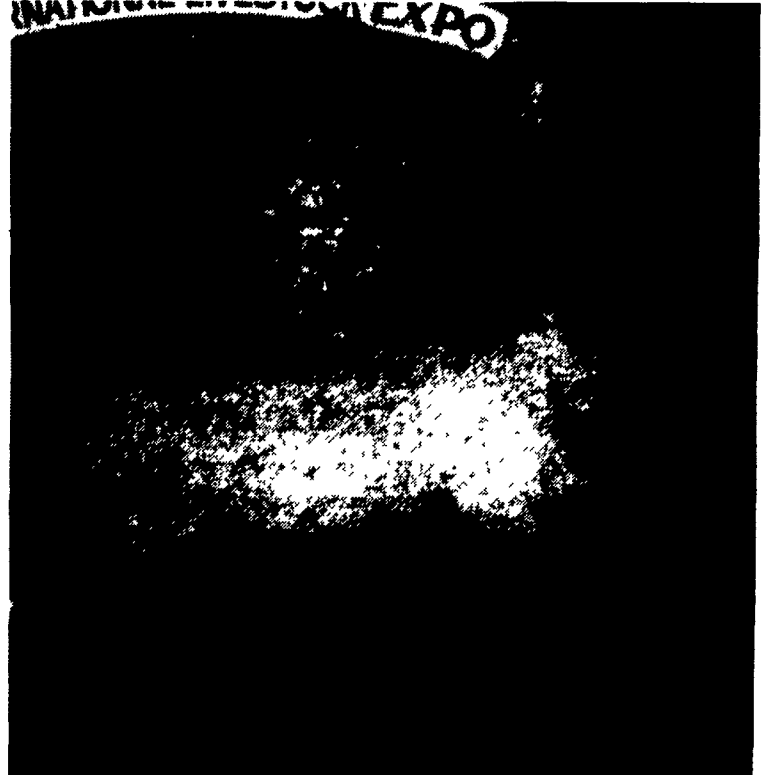
