WHEAT PRICES CLIMBED BACK ON THE BAND WAGON AMID CONTINUED WORLD STOCKS CONCERNS AND OPTIMISTIC EXPORT OUTLOOK. HARVEST PRESSURE AND POSSIBLE INCREASED COUNTRY SELLING WEAKENED CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES. WHEAT 3 TO 6 CENTS HIGHER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 3 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. REPORTS THAT RUSSIA'S WHEAT CROP PRODUCTION COULD BE SUBSTANTIALLY LOWER THAN EARLIER EXPECTATIONS SET WHEAT PRICES ON THE UPHILL CLIMB AGAIN BUT NOT ENOUGH TO MAKE UP FOR RECENT DECLINES. THIS WAS POSITIVE NEWS FOR THE U.S. EXPORT OUTLOOK. CONCERNS OVER TIGHT WORLD STOCKS ADDED SUPPORT TO PRICES. ANXI-

OUS FARMERS RETURNED FIELDS AS FAVORABLE WEATHER RETURNED TO MIDWEST AREAS. SOYBEAN HARVEST IS OVER HALF-WAY COMPLETE AND THE RECORD CROP ISN'T LEAVING MUCH STORAGE ROOM FOR THE UPCOMING BUMPER CORN CROP. ELEVATORS ARE FILLING UP FAST WITH BEANS AND BINS ARE BEGINNING TO SPILL OVER, LEAVING DUMPING OR EARLY SELLING THE ONLY OUTLET FOR THE APPARENT RECORD CORN CROP.
