A LINK WITH THE OCEAN, A LINK WITH THE PAST

ctober 25 marks the anniversary of the opening of the Erie Canal in 1825. The 363-mile-long canal opened an impor-tant water route from Lake Erie to the ocean, but convincing Congress to authorize funding for the project was a long and difficult process. The canal's champion, Governor De Witt Clinton of New York, originally approached Congress in 1810 His first plan was rejected, but he tried again in 1815, and funding was finally approved in 1816. Construction on the \$7.6 million project was started on July



4, 1817. Although political strife led to Clinton's retiring from public life in 1823, his supporters rallied and he was reelected as governor before the canal's completion

EARTHWISE

If you're buying new tires before the season of ice and snow gets underway, here are some things to consider. Radial tires result in the best gas mileage, and steel-belted radials are usually the most efficient. Keep your tires properly inflated - underinflation can waste up to 5% of a car's fuel due to increased rolling resistence. Patronize a dealer who will recy-

cle your old tires. They may charge you a few dollars for this service, but the cost to all of us of not recycling is far greater

BUTTERMILK CORN

BREAD 1 cup whole wheat flour 2 teaspoons baking powder 1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon sait 1 1/2 cups buttermili 2 eggs 1/4 cup vegetable oil

1/4 cup brown sugar Iombine flour, cornmeal, baking powder, baking Usoda, and salt. In a sepa-

rate bowl whisk together remaining ingredients until smooth and add to the flour mixture. Pour ınto a greased 9-ınch square pan and bake at 400° F for about 20 minutes, until golden brown


