Ag Secretary At FFA Convention

ALEXANDRIA, Va. — The 25th U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Mike Espy will speak Thursday afternoon, Nov. 10, to more than 32,000 FFA members, advisors, supporters and guests at the national FFA convention in Kansas City, Mo.

This meeting is the nation's largest annual student convention gathering. Prior to his appointment as secretary of agriculture, Espy represented the second district of Mississippi in the U.S. House of Representatives where he served on the Agricultural and Budget Committees.

The convention will feature action-packed sessions with addresses by top speakers from the fields of agriculture, education, sports and entertainment. Confirmed speakers include Mary Fisher, founder of the Family AIDS Network, Inc.; Florence and Al Joyner, Olympic Gold medalists; author Guy Kawasaki; L. H. "Cotton" Ivy, Commissioner of Agriculture for Tennessee; Craig Karges, extraordinary magician; Dave Roever, Vietnam War Veteran and motivational speaker; Miss America Heather Whitestone from Alabama; and Mayor Emanuel Cleaver of Kansas City, Mo.

Olympic gold medalists Florence and Al Joyner will speak about overcoming Olympic challenges during two Reflections Programs on Wednesday, Nov. 9, at 4:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

In addition, convention participants will have opportunities to attend leadership workshops, tour Kansas City manufacturing and agribusiness sites, take in the American Royal Livestock Show and Rodeo performances and meet with fellow FFA members from around the nation.


