ST. JOSEPH, MO
WEDNESDAY OCTOBER 26, 1994
 FURTHER WHEAT REJECTIONS KEPT WHEAT PRICES ON THE DOWNWARD SLIDE. FALL HARVEST PROGRESS AND BUMPER CORN CROP OUTLOOK, PRESSURED CORN PRICES LOWER. SOYBEAN PRICES, HOWEVER, TURNED SLIGHTLY HIGHER DUE TO FUND BUYING ON THE BOARD. WHEAT MIXED. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 8 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES WERE SLIGHTLY LOWER AS REBIDS FROM YEMEN, BANGLADESH AND THE PHILIPPINES WERE REJECTED BY USDA OVERNIGHT. CHINA REMAINS ABSENT FROM U.S. EXPORT MARKET AND OTHER BOOKINGS ARE NOT TOO IMPRESSIVE. LIGHT FUND SELLING CON-

TINUED TO WEAKEN PRICES. JAPAN'S RECENT WHEAT PURCHASES LIMITED PRICE DECLINES. SLIGHT LOSSES WERE SEEN IN CORN PRICES FROM ONGOING HARVEST PRESSURE AND THE POSSIBILITY USDA WILL RAISE ITS CORN PRODUCTION ESTIMATE. FAVORABLE WEATHER FOR COMBINES AND THE MAJORITY OF THIS YEARS CORN CROP WILL SOON BE FINISHED. HOWEVER, STORAGE CONTINUES TO BE A CONCERN AS ELEVATORS AND BINS ARE FILLING FAST WITH BEANS AND MANY PLACES TURNING CORN AWAY. SOYBEAN PRICES SHOWED LITTLE CHANGE BUT SOME STRENGTH WAS NOTED FROM LIGHT FUND BUYING. SOME SOYBEANS WERE REPORTED LOST ALONG THE COASTAL AREA OF TEXAS DUE TO THE HEAVY FLOODING LAST WEEK AND TRANSPORTATION AND STORAGE REMAINS A PROBLEM.
