A GOOD DAY FOR MUSIC

Two men born on November 6 made a great impact on the world of music. Adolphe Sax was a Belgian musician and inventor born in 1814, and John Philip Sousa, American composer and band conductor, was born in 1854. Sax, the eldest of 11 children of a musical instrument maker, invented the saxophone and a family of brass wind instruments for band and orchestra, the saxhorns. Sousa employed some of those instruments to create his stirring marches. After leading the U.S. Marine Corps Band for 12 years, Sousa formed his own band in 1892. The "March King" toured the U.S. and Europe from 1900 to 1905 and took on a world tour in 1910. The best known of his many pieces is "Stars and Stripes Forever."



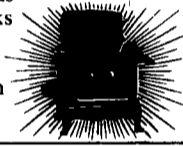

☞ Clothing zippers will wear better and last longer if you always close them before washing.

EARTHWISE

You can successfully clean your oven without resorting to toxic chemicals. Sprinkle the bottom of a cold oven with water, then cover the grime with baking soda and sprinkle again with water. Let soak overnight and wipe up in the morning. Use a green "scrubby" pad to loosen stubborn spots. Be sure to rinse and wipe up all the baking soda. Or, try a citrus-based degreaser. It, too, works best if allowed to soak, and it leaves a fresh orange scent.



CHOCOLATE BREAD PUDDING

- 1 cup soft breadcrumbs
- 2 ounces baking chocolate
- 1 1/4 cups sugar
- 1 1/3 cups milk
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 eggs
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 2/3 cup milk

Combine first four ingredients in a double boiler. Cook until smooth. Add butter, remove from heat. Beat eggs, add remaining ingredients. Add to chocolate mixture. Cook over hot water until thick. Bake in a greased 1 1/2-quart baking dish at 350° F for 20 minutes. **Makes 4 servings**
