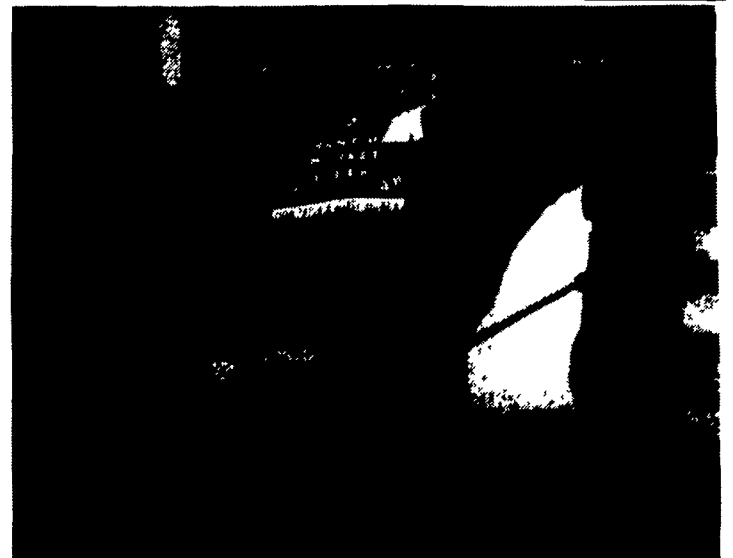
Berks County Holds Beef Roundup, Sale

LEESPORT (Berks Co.) — Leesport Farmers Market was the site of the 1994 Berks County 4-H Beef Club Roundup and Sale.

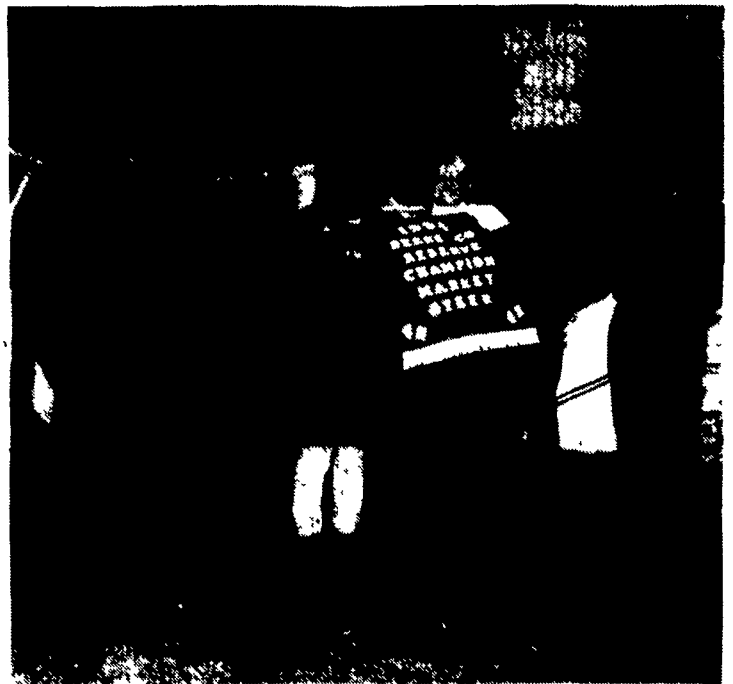

Champion steer was exhibited by Thomas Newpher at the Berks County 4-H Beef Club Roundup.

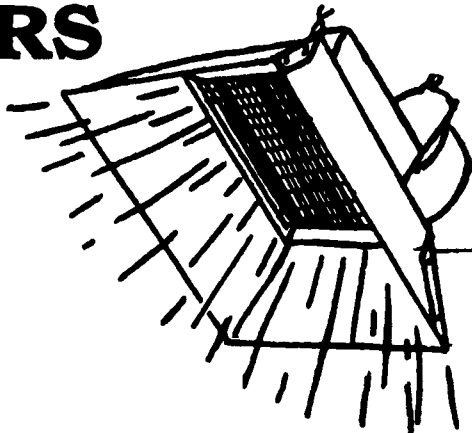


Champion steer was exhibited by Thomas Newpher at the Berks County 4-H Beef Club Roundup.
