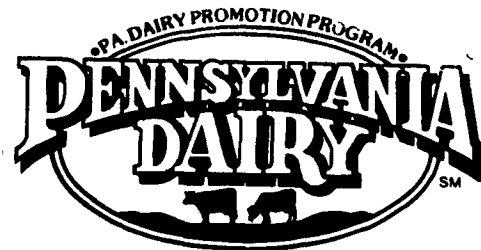
The calf this year has a deep pedigree with outstanding type,
