## Estate Planning Seminars Set

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — The Cooperative Extension Service-University of Maryland at College Park and Farm Credit Banks are offering estate planning seminars for farm, woodland, greenhouse, and nursery owners. The seminars will focus on how to keep property and possessions when land ownership is transferred from one generation to the next.

The Columbia Inn in Columbia (Howard County) will host the

first seminar December 2. The second seminar will be held at the Howard Johnson Plaza Hotel in Hagerstown (Washington County) on December 3. Both seminars will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Speakers from the public and private sectors will help participants:

- Develop a working knowledge of the various types of estate planning tools that are applicable to their unique situations.

- Understand the federal and state tax implications of the various estate planning tools.

- Be motivated and comfortable in seeking local resources to establish their individual estate plans.

For example, John Becker, associate professor of agricultural law and economics at Penn State University, will discuss production agriculture and transferring assets. Ed Thompson from Ameri-

can Farmland Trust in Washington, D.C. will explain conservation easements in estate planning. Other featured speakers, including David Morris, an attorney at Franklin/Morris Associates in Baltimore, and Lloyd Casey from the USDA Forest Service, will

cover related subjects.

Registration is \$40 for individuals and \$75 for a couple or partnership. This fee covers an estate planning workbook and lunch.
