Haying, Grazing Period Open

NORTH CORNWALL (Lebanon Co.) — The official grazing and haying period opened Sept. 1, for land designated as conserving use (CU) for payment under the 1994 acreage reduction programs.

"Farm program participants are now authorized to hay or graze their CU acreage," Jenifer K. Hershey, county executive director of the Lebanon County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, said.

Farmers are not permitted to graze CU for payment land during the 5-month non-grazing period set by the State ASC committee. The non-grazing period in Lebanon County runs from April 1, to August 31.

The 1994 farm program enrollment report showed that 70 acres of Lebanon County cropland was diverted from production to CU for payment. "This acreage has since been planted to cover crops such as grasses, legumes, small grains or put into approved conservation practices," Hershey

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


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


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
