crossing to additional acres for pasture. The streambank fencing program is being paid entirely through the Chesapeake Bay-DER Streambank Fencing Program.

Also, through cost-share money available from the Agriculture Stabilization and Conservation Ser-

vice, two circular concrete spring-fed troughs were installed on the pastures.

"We're concerned about the water quality in the creek," said McMullen. "We're only four miles from the river here, we're downstream, we're at the end of the chain."
