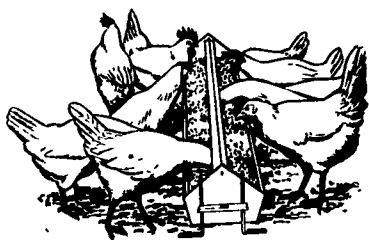

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was seasonally light, but was generally sufficient to keep the fully adequate to ample supply from accumulating. Live supplies were moderate; weights were in a full range and were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were

unchanged at 47 to 58 cents. Trade sentiment was steady at best, and was affected by buyers shifting interest to stocking up on other items for the upcoming Holiday. In the parts complex, wings were adequate and in best balance. Other items were fully sufficient for current needs.

Prices were slightly higher on light type fowl for this week's slaughter. Offerings have slowed temporarily as producers hold flocks for needed egg inventories. Demand was moderate to good. Sales were too few to report on heavy hens. Availability was short to no better than in balance. Finished sales were fairly active due to seasonal buying and government purchase programs. Undertone fully steady but cautious on leghorns and at least steady on heavies.

Supplies were adequate or available in all regions, and extra eggs were usually held with varying degrees of confidence. Breaking stock supplies were adequate from regular commitments, and few plants sought additional eggs; the undertone was steady. Live hen offerings were adequate to fully adequate for the light to moderate demand, and the trade sentiment was steady.
