WHEAT PRICES WERE MOD-ERATELY LOWER, WEAKENED BY FAVORABLE GROWING WEATHER IN WINTER WHEAT AREAS, INCREASED WHEAT STOCKS FIG-URE AND DISAPPOINTING EXPORT OUTLOOK. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES CLIMBED SLIGHTLY HIGH-ER ON ACTIVE FUND BUYING ON THE BOARD AND CONCERNS THAT FINAL LEG OF HARVEST WILL BE DELAYED AGAIN BY RAIN. WHEAT 3 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. CORN 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 3 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 3 TO 6 CENTS HIGHER. SLUGGISH EXPORT BUSINESS AND INDICATIONS CHI-NA, RUSSIA AND FORMER SOVIET UNION WILL BE IMPORTING LESS U.S. WHEAT THAN EARLIER EXPECTED, PUSHED WHEAT PRICES LOWER. ADDITIONAL WEAKNESS STEMMED FROM USDA'S SUPPLY/ DEMAND REPORT SHOWING AN INCREASE IN U.S. AND WORLD WHEAT ENDING STOCKS. BENEFI-CIAL RAINS FELL IN CENTRAL PLAINS AND FORECASTS FOR MORE IN WINTER WHEAT AREAS, ALSO PRESSURED PRICES. CORN PRICES EXTENDED GAINS AS ACTIVE FUND BUYING AND WET WEATHER FORE-CASTS FOR MIDWEST AREAS ADDED STRENGTH

TODAY'S USDA CROP PRODUCTION REPORT SPURRED EARLY PROFIT TAKING BUT SELLERS SOON BECAME BUYERS. CORN PRODUC-TION WAS FORE- CAST AT A **RECORD HIGH 10.0 BILLION** BUSHELS, UP 4 PERCENT FROM OCTOBER 1 FORE- CAST AND 56 PERCENT ABOVE 1993 CROP. STRONG SOYOIL DEMAND CON-TINUED TO SUPPORT SOYBEAN PRICES FOR THE SEVENTH CONSE-CUTIVE DAY AND SPILLOVER STRENGTH FROM CORN PITS WAS ALSO A POSITIVE FACTOR, USDA **REVISED THEIR SOYBEAN PRODUC-**TION ESTIMATE TO 2.52 BILLION BUSHELS, UP 3 PERCENT FROM OCTOBER 1. THIS INCREASE HAD BEEN FACTORED INTO THE MARK-ET EARLIER IN THE WEEK.
