REPORTS OF WORLD SHORT WHEAT CROPS AND PRICES ENJOYED A BIG UPSWING THIS SUMMER AND EAR-LY FALL. SUBSTANTIAL EXPORT ORDERS, BIDS REJECTED AND LATER SOLD HIGHER, EVERYONE WANTED PART OF THE ACTION AND FUTURES SOARED. WHEAT STOCKS STARTED SHOWING UP, EXPORTS TAPERED OFF, AND EVERYBODY STARTED BAILING OUT. FUTURES TUMBLED AND HIT AN ELEVEN WEEK LOW TODAY.

INDUSTRY TRYING TO LOOK AT THE BRIGHT SPOTS IN THE CORN MARKET. PRICES SUBSTANTIALLY BELOW A YEAR AGO AND A WEAK ER DOLLAR BENEFICIAL FOR EXPORT ORDERS.
