HARD TIMES ON WHEAT PRICES THE PAST SEVERAL WEEKS. CORN, SORGHUM AND SOYBEANS TRYING TO COME BACK FROM RECORD CROP HARVEST PEAK, LOW TIMES. WHEAT 2-5 CENTS LOWER. CORN AND SORGHUM STEADY TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 1-3 CENTS LOWER.
REPORTS OF WORLD SHORT WHEAT CROPS AND PRICES ENJOYED A BIG UPSWING THIS SUMMER AND EARLY FALL. SUBSTANTIAL EXPORT ORDERS, BIDS REJECTED AND LATER SOLD HIGHER, EVERYONE WANTED PART OF THE ACTION AND FUTURES SOARED. WHEAT STOCKS STARTED SHOWING UP, EXPORTS TAPERED OFF, AND EVERYBODY STARTED BAILING OUT. FUTURES TUMBLED AND HIT AN ELEVEN WEEK LOW TODAY.
INDUSTRY TRYING TO LOOK AT THE BRIGHT SPOTS IN THE CORN MARKET. PRICES SUBSTANTIALLY BELOW A YEAR AGO AND A WEAKER DOLLAR BENEFICIAL FOR EXPORT ORDERS. A FEW EXPORT SALES ON THE BOOKS LAST WEEK AND TODAY. HOWEVER, THIS NOTHING TO WRITE HOME ABOUT AND YEAR TO DATE CORN INSPECTED FOR EXPORT RUNNING 10 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO. RAIN HALTED LATE FALL HARVEST, ESTIMATED 85 TO 90 PERCENT COMPLETED. FARMER BINS AND ELEVATORS OVERFLOWING WITH PRODUCERS KEEPING OWNERSHIP OF LARGER THAN USUAL AMOUNT DUE TO RELATIVELY CHEAP PRICES.
SOYBEAN PRICES MAKING A GOOD COMEBACK IN THE PAST THREE WEEKS, UP NEARLY 30 CENTS. EXPORT ORDERS AND GOOD SUPPORT FROM BOTH OIL AND MEAL, ESPECIALLY WORLD OIL DEMAND, FACTORS IN THE UPTURNS. ALSO, STRONG FARMER HOLDINGS OF BEANS. SUBSTANTIALLY LOWER SOYBEAN PRICES AND WEAKER DOLLAR SHOULD

KEEP FOREIGNERS INTERESTED.
