

Prices were unchanged to lower for mediums in the Mid-Atlantic region, and the balance of prices were unchanged. The market tone remained steady to weak with an underlying cautiousness. Demand continued to cover the full range, and was moderate to very good. Retail specials provided the best cartoned egg movement. Supplies were adequate or available. Most breakers, slaughter plants, and packing plants planned reduced schedules for the Thanksgiving holiday. Breaking stock supplies were fully adequate for the very light demand, and prices were unchanged. Live hen offerings were at least adequate for the unaggressive demand, and the undertone was about steady.
