MARKET COMMENT: THE MARKET TONE WAS CAUTIOUSLY STEADY TO WEAK. DEMAND WAS FAIR TO GOOD FOR IMMEDIATE HOLIDAY NEEDS, AND POST-HOLIDAY MOVEMENT WAS A CONCERN. SUPPLIES OF ALL SIZES WERE ADEQUATE FOR AVAILABLE. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE, AND PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO LOWER. A EXTRA LARGE .68-.70, LARGE .66-.68, MEDIUM .54-.59.

TRADING ABOUT DONE FOR THIS WEEK, TWO SHORT TRADING DAYS AND HOLIDAY THURSDAY AT THE BOARDS. GRAIN PRICES MOSTLY

LOWER, WHEAT HIT HARD, BUT SOYBEAN PRICES MAKING A COMEBACK AFTER MONDAY'S SHARP BREAK. WHEAT 2-9 CENTS LOWER. CORN 2 CENTS HIGHER TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 3 CENTS HIGHER TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 2-3 CENTS HIGHER.

WHEAT PRICES TOOK A SHARP DROP TODAY, JUST WHEN IT LOOKED LIKE SOME EXPORT ORDERS MAY SHOW UP AFTER THE 1.3 MILLION EGYPT ALLOCATION MONDAY. NEARBY FUTURES SUBSTANTIALLY LOWER, BUT 1995 NEW CROP WHEAT POSTED SMALL GAINS DESPITE THE FACT RAINS FELL OVER A LARGE PART OF THE WINTER WHEAT COUNTRY AND CROPS LOOKING GOOD.

CORN CONTINUED IN A SIDEWAYS MARKET, BUT AGAIN MORE TO THE MINUS SIDE. NO NEWS OR EVEN RUMORS TO MOVE PRICES ANY DIRECTIONS. RECORD CROP HOLDING IN STRONG HANDS AND CHEAP PRICES FAILING TO DRUM UP ANY EXPORT BUSINESS.

SOYBEAN PRICES REGAINED PART OF MONDAY'S SHARP DECLINE PRICE SUPPORTS FROM OILSEEDS FELL BY THE WAYSIDE THE PAST SEVERAL DAYS. SOYBEAN MEAL EXPORT ORDER FAILED TO GET MUCH RECOGNITION.

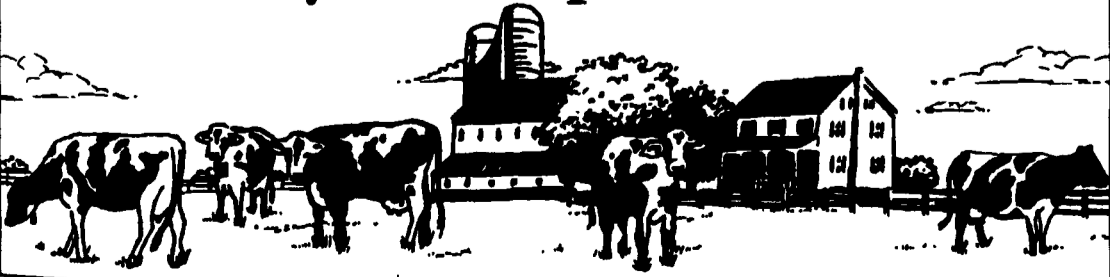
