 WHEAT PRICES WERE SUPPORTED BY GOOD EXPORT DEMAND FROM AFRICA AND LATE FUND BUYING ON THE BOARD DUE TO REPORTS THAT CHINA MAY SOON BE IN THE U.S. EXPORT MARKET FOR WHEAT NEEDS. CORN PRICES MOVED SLIGHTLY HIGHER FROM CARRY-OVER EXPORT SUPPORT AND STRONGER WHEAT PRICES. PROFIT TAKING DROVE SOYBEAN PRICES MODERATELY LOWER ON SOYBEAN WEAKNESS AND CONTINUED IMPROVEMENT IN THE BEAN CROP CONDITION IN BRAZIL. WHEAT 6 TO 8 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM MIXED. SOYBEANS 5 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. EXPORT DEMAND HAS BEEN GOOD FOR WHEAT THIS WEEK, ESPECIALLY AFTER TODAY'S AFRICAN PURCHASE. CHINA HAS BEEN REPORTED SEEKING SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNTS OF WHEAT AND OPTIMISM FOR U.S. TO BE IN THE RUNNING WAS SUPPORTIVE TO PRICES. FUND BUYING SET IN LATE IN THE TRADING PERIOD, PUSHING WHEAT PRICES MODERATELY HIGHER. STRONGER CORN PRICES WERE INFLUENCED BY ADVANCES IN WHEAT PITS AND GOOD EXPORT DEMAND. THE LACK OF DELIVERIES AGAINST THE

DECEMBER CONTRACT ADDED TO HIGHER CORN PRICES. SOYBEAN PRICES MOVED MODERATELY LOWER FOR THE SECOND DAY, PRESSURED BY LOWER SOYBEAN PRICES AND THE BUMPER CROP EFFECT. INDICATIONS BRAZIL'S BEAN CROP IS LOOKING GOOD AND RECEIVING BENEFICIAL RAINFALL SPURRED FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD.
