

Prices were unchanged to higher on mediums in the Midwest and the Mid-Atlantic area, unchanged elsewhere. The market tone was steady to firm, mostly steady to fully steady. Demand was mostly moderate to good, best where features were in progress or planned. Supplies of the large sizes were adequate to synthesis and mediums were adequate to tight. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to instances barely adequate for the mixed but mostly moderate demand, and prices trended higher. Live hen offerings were at least fully adequate for the limited interest, and the undertone was generally steady.
