Pumpkin Cheesecake Roll

- 8-ounces soft-style cream cheese
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 4 eggs
- 1 tablespoon milk
- 3/4 cup flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup canned pumpkin

Cream cheese icing
Grease a 15x10x1-inch baking pan; line with waxed paper; grease paper. Reserve 2 tablespoons cream cheese. Combine the remaining cream cheese and 1/2 cup sugar; mix until blended. Add one of the eggs and milk; beat until smooth. Spread in prepared pan; set aside. Stir together flour, baking powder, cinnamon, and salt. In large mixer bowl beat remaining eggs at high speed for 5 minutes. Gradually add 1 cup sugar, beating until sugar dissolves. Stir in pumpkin. Fold in dry ingredients. Spread over cheese mixture. Bake in 375 degree oven for 15 minutes. Loosen cake from sides of pan. Turn out onto towel sprinkled with confectioners' sugar. Carefully peel off paper. Starting with narrow end, roll cake up fairly tightly without towel. Cool. Garnish with icing and grated orange peel, if desired. Serves 10.

Cream cheese icing: Combine the reserved 2 tablespoons cream cheese, 1 tablespoon milk, and 1/4 teaspoon vanilla. Stir in one cup sifted powdered sugar, blend until smooth.

ANSWER — A Pine Grove reader wanted a recipe for ice cream that does not use eggs. She also wanted a sugar-free ice cream recipe if available. We did not receive sugar-free recipes but we did receive several ice cream recipes made without eggs. Thanks to a reader who writes that she always uses the ice cream recipe that comes with the Junket rennet tablet box to make ice cream without eggs. You can substitute milk for the cream. Junket is a registered trademark. The tablets come in a box of 12. The box is about 2 1/2 x 2 1/4 inches. It is usually sold in stores where Jell-O is shelved. But not every store carries it. Use Holidays To Teach Children

UNIVERSITY PARK, (Centre Co.) — Holiday gift-giving can be difficult for children. Store displays and television commercials may convince them they need everything they see. But a child's allowance probably is insufficient to buy gifts for Mom and Dad, brothers and sisters, grandparents and teachers.

With a little help from parents, the holidays can be an opportunity

for children to learn good spending habits and the value of money, said a Penn State expert in family resource management.

"Children should have an active role in gift-giving," said Dr. Marilyn Furry, associate professor of extension education in the College of Agricultural Sciences.

"Parents should guide and advise, rather than direct and dictate what children buy," Furry

said. "Allow children to learn from their mistakes and successes. The holiday season is a good time to show them how to make a spending plan and keep track of money spent."

Furry said handmade gifts from children often are the most appreciated. "Help children make gifts for teachers and grandparents," she said. "Take the kids shopping to buy needed supplies. If they have other gifts to buy, devote a shopping trip to helping them. Don't expect them to do all their shopping while you are running through crowded stores trying to get your chores done."

At this time of year, parents also may want to consider the various ways their children receive spending money. "Giving money for special needs and requests may make sense for young children and for certain expenses such as school fees," said Furry. "But with this method, the parent makes the spending decisions and the child has no responsibility."

An allowance is a better way to help a child learn how to manage money. "An allowance can be used any way the child chooses," she said.

Philadelphia Ice Cream

Scald:
1 quart cream

Add:
3/4 cup sugar
Few grains salt

Stir until sugar dissolves. Chill. Add the following:
1 1/2 tablespoons vanilla OR 1 teaspoon grated vanilla bean
Freeze in hand cranked ice cream freezer according to manufacturer's instructions.

For a lighter version, use 3 cups cream and 1 cup milk.

Dairy Queen Ice Cream

Soak 2 envelopes unflavored gelatin in 1/2 cup cold water. Heat 4 cups whole milk until hot but not boiling. Remove from heat and add:

2 cups sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla
1 teaspoon salt

Cool and add:

3 cups cream

Freeze five to six hours.

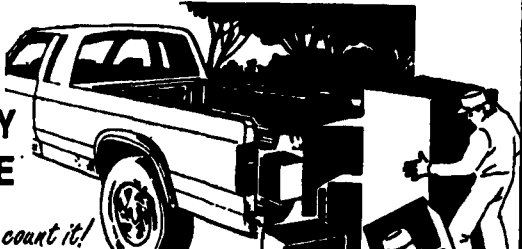
