Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was tapering, but generally remained sufficient to keep current offerings balanced to closely cleared. Live supplies were moderate; weights were desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were curtailed again, but remained very heavy in total. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 50 to 61 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady. In the parts complex, bone-in breasts were well cleared to short. Wings were only adequate at best. Other items were generally noted as adequate for a lighter buying interest.
