National Shorthorn Show Held

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — The 1994 National Shorthorn Show held in conjunction with the North American International Livestock Exposition demonstrated the quality, positive direction and increased standing attained by the Shorthorn breed in the last few years.

In total, 233 head of Shorthorn bulls and females were paraded in front of the judge, Dr. Jim Newsome of Jackson, Miss., and the associate judge, Randy Daniel of Colbert, Ga. With quality running deep into the classes, the judges congratulated the breed on its foresight and the positive moves made within the breed.

Taking home the grand champion bull honor was MTS Special Effect *x, exhibited by Robert and Beverly Alden, Hamilton, Mo.; Dean Farms, Cleburne, Texas; and Fair Acres Stock Farm, Waldorf, Minn. Earlier named the junior champion bull, he was sired by Jordan *x and bred by the Mike Studer Family, Wesley, Iowa, and Marlan and Brenda Korthaus, Moulton, Iowa. A July '93 summer yearling, the 7.6 frame bull weighed in at 1,772 pounds and posted a 3.54 WDA.

After standing second in class behind the grand champion, JG Cactus Jack 9340 *x went on to be named the reserve junior champion and captured the reserve grand champion bull title. The July '93 summer yearling was exhibited by

Good Family Shorthorns, Barnard, Kan.; Bar JS Shorthorns, Ellsworth, Kan.; and Jett-Gardner Polled Shorthorns, Beaver, Okla. Jett-Gardner Polled Shorthorns bred the 7.0 frame bull sired by C Cisco SE 5329 x. He weighed in at 1,530 pounds and posted a 3.05 WDA.

In the highly competitive female show, the grand champion female was exhibited by Don Cagwin, Virginia, Ill.; Cop Top Shorthorns, Dawson, Ill.; and Liberty Hill Farms, Freedom, Ind. LF Lucky Charm *, earlier named the junior champion, was bred by Kurt Lehman, Reedsburg, Wis. The May '93 late spring yearling female was sired by Tonquish Monarch and had a 8.5 frame score.

Grabbing the reserve grand champion female honors was Sutherland Amber 359. Exhibited and bred by Holt-Ragsdale Sutherland Shorthorns, Prospect, Ky., the October '93 senior heifer was sired by Mill Brook Ransom G9. First named the senior calf champion, she had a 7.7 frame score.

Other bull champions included senior champion - Sutherland Titleist 269 ET x, exhibited by John C. and David Ragsdale, Prospect, Ky.; reserve senior champion - Green Ridge Courier ET x, exhibited by Blue Mountain Shorthorns, Lehighton, Pa., and Woodside Farm, Waynesburg, Pa.; senior calf champion - Mar-

tindell Powerdream 564 *x, exhibited by C.F. Martin III, Hardyville, Ky.; reserve senior calf champion - CF Ultimate Drive X *x, exhibited by Rex Cates & Family, Modoc, Ind., and Bill Razor, Allen, Texas.








